



# Banana squish scarf

a total beginner's pattern, if you can knit and purl, you can make this scarf, baby-sized for near-immediate satisfaction. This ribbed baby scarf features a "keyhole" solution to ensure it stays put on your little 'uns

## ingredients

**finished size** 54 cm long, to fit 0-12 months

**yarn** Jaeger Baby Merino DK ½x 50g ball (colour: #192 )

**needles size** 4.5mm straight. Adjust needle size if necessary to obtain correct gauge. Optional: 3.5mm crochet hook.

**notions** tapestry needle

**gauge** 28sts and 22 rows = 10 cm in ribbing NOT STRETCHED

## stitch guide

**ribbing** \*k2, p2\* repeat from \* to \* to end of rnd.

## scarf

Using long-tail method, CO 24 sts. Beg with a WS row, work in ribbing until scarf measures 42cm ending with a WS row.

On next row (RS), continue ribbing pattern as est and work as follows: work 6 sts, cast off 12 sts, work 6 sts.

On following row (WS), work 6 sts, CO 12 sts (using thumb method), work remaining 6 sts.

Continue ribbing as previously est for a further 12cm until scarf measures 54 cm. Cast off in pattern.

Using crochet hook work one row of dc, along the keyhole to give it stability.



## finishing

Weave in ends. Block lightly to finished measurements. Give to your favourite baby to wear and enjoy!

## glossary

**CO**=cast on; **st**=stitch; **k**=knit; **p**=purl; **PM**=place marker; **rnd**=round; **sl**=slip; **kwise**=knit wise; **pwis**=purlwise; **k2tog**=knit 2 sts together; **ssk**=slip 1 st kwise, sl 1 st pwis, knit both sts together; **RS**=right-side; **WS**=wrong-side; **pu**=pick up; **beg**=beginning; **DPN(s)**=double pointed needle(s); **est**=established; **dc**=double crochet



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
